THUNDERBIRD COMMUNITY IMPACT MANAGEMENT

In the 2016-2017 phase of the Thunderbird community impact management process, consultation was undertaken to identify community issues, impacts and opportunities. The views of stakeholders were captured, and a preliminary analysis undertaken and presented in the Thunderbird Bankable Feasibility Study (BFS) and back to the community.

As we prepare for construction, the current phase of the process has seen further analysis of stakeholder feedback; and, development of management plans in response to the findings.

The purpose of the upcoming community consultation task is to validate stakeholder and community sentiments and priority themes, and to present the high-level management responses.
